Band receives money for being at games, Whereas BITS is all pure profit so any donations are welcome. (Last year \$5K of profit from BITS.)
- B. Income from August through now \$5288.87 not including car wash (still don't have numbers).
- C. Need to push sponsorships again. Only a handful of kids have done any of the work. This is vital for the continuation of our band's success. Looking into incentives for the students.
- D. Flower sales for Winter is November 1-15. Delivery December 6th. (Next sale will be at the school morning help from parents, with students help it should go very quickly. We will not need the longer parent spot.)
